Hunter developed an early interest in Fantasy and Science Fiction novels. The embers for storytelling slowly began to ignite, and he spent much of his youth reading, playing board games, and creating his own worlds.

Alongside his geeky endeavors, cinema also became a passion. Hunter would follow that passion, attending Vancouver Film School in 2009 where he received a diploma in 'Film Studies and Screenplay Writing'. After graduating, he immediately began working on the production side of the film industry in Vancouver for the greater part of a decade. A few notable projects he worked on: Seventh Son (Film), Fringe (Series), Arctic Air (CBC Series), Still Standing (CBC Series).

Hunter also worked on his own film projects during this time, writing and directing sketch-comedy videos for YouTube channel Motion Radio, and in 2015 writing and directing his dark-comedy short film: 'Pine Pinchers'.

'Pine Pinchers' would go on to be accepted into the 2015 National Screen Institute of Canada's Short Film Festival.

Other notable achievements for Hunter in film:

- Accepted into 2011 SharpCuts Independent Film Festival (Guelph, Ontario) for his short film 'Malady'.
- 2012 Golden Brads Short Script Competition longlist (Top 50) For his script 'Rarefied Carnivores'

Eventually, Hunter would return back to his home province of Ontario. Here he met his partner, Kym. Always having that creative spark, Hunter joined Kym in her award-winning wedding photography business.

Motivated by Kym's entrepreneurial spirit, Hunter successfully published a children's book (Rinny & Oko, 2017), and board game (Ugly Christmas Sweaters, 2020). This all paved the way for Hunter to complete his debut novel (Space Junk: Freight the Power, 2023).

'Space Junk: Freight the Power' encapsulates Hunter's writing approach: a cinematic-style story that doesn't get lost in the details. It is frantically-paced, action-packed, filled with heart- and a *ton* of laughs. He aspires to be an author that readers can trust to bring a Herculean-hit-of-humor to their lives.

His second novel 'Bring Back Bubblegum', another hilarious romp, is due out early 2024.

Hunter currently resides in Peterborough, Ontario; living a beautiful, coffee-fueled, 'stay-at-home-dad' life with his partner, Kym, their two wonderful little humans, Rain & Mads- and a pack of dogs.
