His first novel, *The Best Laid Plans*, began as a podcast, then was self-published, won the Stephen Leacock Medal for Humour, was re-published by McClelland & Stewart to great reviews, was crowned the 2011 winner of CBC's Canada Reads as "the essential Canadian novel of the decade," and was adapted as a CBC Television series and a stage musical. His next two novels, *The High Road* and *Up and Down* were finalists for the Leacock Medal, and in 2015, he won the prize a second time, for his fourth book, *No Relation*. His other novels include *Poles Apart*, *One Brother Shy*, *Albatross*, and *Operation Angus*, and were all national bestsellers.
